



FOREST SERVICE FREE USE FIREWOOD OFFERING



The Seward Ranger District is making firewood available to the public mid-June.

Access to the firewood area is via a USFS access road located on the west side of the Seward Highway at mile 38.9. The Hemlock logs available for firewood have been decked for over 12 months.

Access to the cutting area will be determined by weather and ground conditions. The area may be closed in wet, muddy, or other hazardous conditions to minimize damage to the road/cutting area, and to provide safe public access. Call the Seward or Glacier Ranger District Offices for information on area closures.

The wood is a result of the on-going Devils Creek Vegetation Project with the objectives of regenerating birch, aspen, and other vegetation important for moose browse; hazardous fuels reduction; and providing firewood for the communities.

A free permit will be required to remove wood from the area
